Guidelines to Follow When Nominating a Hero

Nominees should live or work in the Badger Chapter's service area which includes the counties of Adams, Columbia, Crawford, Dane, Grant, Iowa, Juneau, Lafayette, Richland and Sauk.

Award winners must be able to attend the Real Heroes Celebration. Admission is complimentary for the winner and one guest.

Award winners must agree to participate in a video segment to be shown at the celebration and permit the use of their stories and photographs for publicity purposes.

Nominations must be received by January 7, 2011 to be considered for the Real Heroes Celebration.

How to Nominate Your Hero

Your nomination should include:

- **This nomination form.**
- **500 words or less** describing the act of courage or kindness, how their act shares the spirit of the American Red Cross, and explaining why your hero deserves to be recognized.
- **Two supporting documents**, such as letters of support, news articles or photographs (supporting documents are optional but encouraged).

Real Heroes Award Categories

An Adult Good Samaritan/Rescue Hero has helped another person in critical need utilizing skills aligned with those taught in an American Red Cross training program, has assisted another person or a group in times of a disaster

A Community Hero has served in a volunteer capacity helping others, either on a regular basis or in response to an immediate need

A Youth Good Samaritan has demonstrated courage, initiative and/or compassion in the spirit of the American Red Cross in service to another individual or to the community

A Health Care Hero is a person working in the health care field who has integrated the principles of the American Red Cross while demonstrating great initiative, caring and leadership

A Hero of a Lifetime has lived a life of dedication to others, incorporating the values of the American Red Cross and making a profound difference in his or her community

A Corporate Real Hero is a business or organization that has contributed significantly to the American Red Cross through training, volunteer time or financial support

From the Heart Hero is a person who has donated blood on a regular consistent basis or has supported blood donation through volunteering at area blood drives
